When I went further to understand his question, he said to me, "I did want my children to school in the village, therefore, I decided to bring them with me here in Accra but Victoria will not come and she is convincing the others not to come." He said, "When I asked her why, she said she would get the exact church like she has there at Fiapre, that is why I asked you what kind of church do you have at Fiapre?" He added the reason why he was calling me now is that she has now begun quoting Bible verses to him to prove that she has the right church. After hearing him out, I went to Victoria after the evening service to hear her myself. Victoria told me she is not moving to the city because our church has helped her a lot. She added she didn't know where she would be today had it not been for my preaching and teaching. As a Ghanaian, it is so amazing to me that a teenager like Victoria will abandon living and schooling in the city because of church. I praise the Lord for placing this church here at Fiapre and also working in the hearts of our young people.

Also, I had one of my sisters visit our church two weeks ago. Before she left, she called me and my wife together and said, "I want you two to do me a favor." When my wife asked what it was about she said, "Try to get me any job that can keep me here so that I can attend your church." She believes she can learn a lot from this church. Then she started talking about my wife's convert Elizabeth. She said while she was praising God for the church to somebody, Elizabeth came to her and said, "I never thought I would stay in a church until I came to this church." One thing that is exciting is the fact that Victoria, my sister Pokua and Elizabeth are all emphasizing their reasons for liking the same thing; the teaching and preaching of God's word. I am so thankful to God for giving us a wonderful church and wonderful people in the church.
